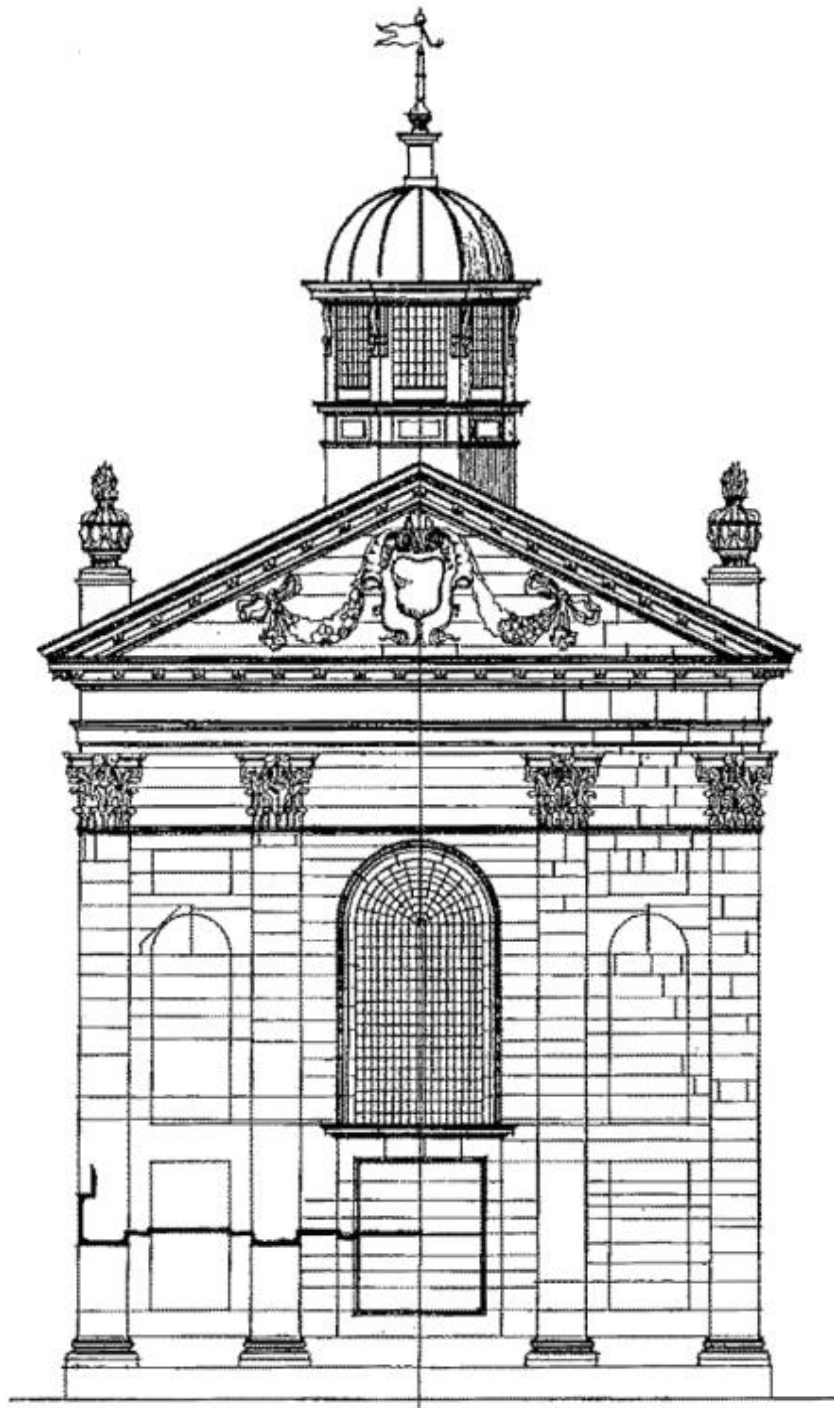

Choral Compline

The Choir will sing the late-night service of Choral Compline, by candlelight, at 9.30 pm on Wednesdays **25 January and 29 February**. Cocoa and biscuits follow.

Candlemas – Thursday 2 February, 7.30 pm

A candlelit Sung Eucharist to celebrate Candlemas – the great Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple – on the fortieth day after Christmas. This is the Term's united service (Corporate Communion). All Christians in College, from all our various traditions, are most warmly encouraged to come together for the Eucharist and (free) supper party in the Old Library afterwards.

The Diamond Jubilee of the Queen's Accession will be celebrated at evensong on 5 February.

Faith of the Foundress Service – Thursday 16 February, 6.30pm

A service of readings and music associated with Mary of St Pol, and from her era. A chance to reach back to the very earliest traditions of the College and hear some of the music and words which may have influenced her decision to found a place of religion and learning.

Evensong at Peterborough Cathedral – Saturday 18 February

The Choir will be singing Evensong at Peterborough Cathedral at 3.30 pm on 18 February. Supporters are welcome and should contact the Dean about arrangements.

Ash Wednesday – Wednesday 22 February, 7.30 pm

We mark the beginning of Lent, the season of preparation for Easter, by offering a Sung Eucharist including the ceremony of the Imposition of Ashes. A Lenten supper, for charity, follows.

A devotional service for Lent, featuring choral and organ music for the reading of St Matthew's account of the Passion of Christ.
