KEITH SYKES RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IN ITALIAN STUDIES

Following three successful tenures of the Keith Sykes Research Fellowship -- Dr Claudia Bolgia was appointed to a Lectureship in the History of Art at Edinburgh University, Dr Kenneth Clarke to an Anniversary Research Lectureship in Medieval Literature at the University of York, and Dr Ambrogio Camozzi is currently in the final year of his outstandingly successful tenure of the Fellowship -- the College welcomes applications from scholars with interests in any aspect of Italian culture from the age of Dante to the present: relevant disciplines may include Italian language and literature, music, history and art history. Candidates should have recently completed, or be about to complete, a doctoral degree. The tenure of the Fellowship will be for five years. The holder will be encouraged to do a limited amount of teaching for the College, and to offer an annual course of lectures in the University Department or Faculty with which he or she will be affiliated, but would require the permission of the Governing Body to undertake other paid work; the holder will also be expected to support an annual "Italian evening", and other related events, and the annual Keith Sykes Lecture. The stipend will be based on points .30 to .34 of the University's scale for academic stipends. This is currently £22,494 for a candidate who has not yet completed a doctorate, rising to £25,298 once the degree has been awarded; teaching will be separately remunerated.

Research Fellows are offered subsidized accommodation, in college if unaccompanied, in college-owned flats or houses if partnered; where accommodation is not required the Keith Sykes Research Fellow will be provided with a study in College. Research Fellows, like every Fellow of the College, are members of the Governing Body, and enjoy a range of benefits and privileges as well as responsibilities. These include seven free meals per week at High Table, access to a Fellows' Research Fund, and eligibility for support for conferences or workshops Fellows organize in Cambridge.
