The College hopes to elect not later than 31 January 2018 to the following Fellowship starting from 1 October 2018:

THE MARK KAPLANOFF RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IN HISTORY

The tenure of the Fellowship will be for three years. Its primary purpose is to enable postdoctoral research in History. The holder will be expected to do a limited amount of teaching for the College, typically of four hours per week throughout the twenty teaching weeks of the academic year, in the form of undergraduate supervision (individual or small group teaching) of topics relevant to their own research, but would require the permission of the Governing Body to undertake other paid work. The stipend will be at least £22,494 p.a. Applications are welcomed from outstandingly able researchers in History who have recently completed a doctoral degree or who are about to complete their doctoral studies; they will be expected to present a detailed plan for the postdoctoral research they wish to undertake during their Fellowship.

Pembroke College has a distinguished tradition of education and research in History. The Research Fellowship is named in memory of Dr Mark Kaplanoff, Fellow and University Lecturer in American History between 1979 and his death in 2001. The first Kaplanoff Research Fellow in History, Dr Sian Pooley, is now a Tutorial Fellow at Magdalen College, Oxford. Current Fellows in History include Dr Caroline Burt, College Lecturer in Medieval British History; Dr Paul Cavill, University Lecturer in Early Modern British History; Dr Henning Grunwald, DAAD Lecturer in Modern European History; Professor Jon Parry, Professor of Modern British History; Dr Paul Warde, University Lecturer in Environmental History; and Dr Emily Jones, Research Fellow in Nineteenth Century British History.

Research Fellows are offered subsidized accommodation, in college if unaccompanied, in college-owned flats or houses if partnered; where accommodation is not required the Mark Kaplanoff Research Fellow will be provided with a study in College. Research Fellows, like every Fellow of the College, are members of the Governing Body, and enjoy a range of benefits and privileges as well as responsibilities. These include seven free meals per week at High Table, access to a Fellows' Research Fund, and eligibility for support for conferences or workshops Fellows organize in Cambridge.
