Combined Fall and Spring Semester 2024-25 Programme Fees

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, certain programme events and activities will be kept under review and may be revised or replaced based on the latest guidance from the UK Government and Public Health England

If you're thinking of applying for the Combined Semester Programme, make sure you've first read the <u>important information on our programme fees</u>. Note that all fees must be paid **in full** before the start of the programme. If your financial aid will be released later than this, please contact us to discuss the arrangements.

You'll need to make your payments to us in British Pounds. You can calculate the cost in other currencies on the <u>XE currency conversion website</u>.

Programme Deposit: £9,850

To secure your place on the programme, you will be asked to pay a deposit within one month of after accepting the offer of a place. This deposit will be <u>deducted</u> from the fees below, which will be due before the start of the programme.

If you can provide evidence that you receive financial aid, you will be eligible to pay a lower deposit of £3,000.

University Fee: £25,734

This fee covers:

- Matriculation as a full member of the University of Cambridge
- Access to the Cambridge University Library
- Access to departmental and faculty libraries
- Access to relevant lectures (special arrangements apply to certain subjects/papers; in most cases
- students can attend lectures for any subject, not just those for the papers they are enrolled in)
- Membership of the University of Cambridge alumni network
- Access to University societies, clubs and events (additional membership fees may apply)
- Access to University social and sports facilities (additional membership fees may apply)

 Access to University support and welfare systems, including counselling services and Careers Service

Programme Fee: £39,698

This fee covers:

- 1. Tuition and academic and welfare support
 - Matriculation as a full member of Pembroke College
 - Thorough pre-arrival academic and practical advice and information
 - Comprehensive orientation and induction week

– Tuition for four intensive Cambridge-style papers (= courses) over three terms, normally in the form of one-on-one tutorials with an expert in your field, usually 12 US credits per paper and including assessment and transcript

 Opportunity to undertake an individual research project in the form of a dissertation in place of a standard supervision, if appropriate for your paper and subject to supervisor approval
Comprehensive feedback on your supervision work

- College-based individual academic and study support with personal Director of Studies
- College-based pastoral support with personal Tutor
- College-based welfare and medical support, including College Nurse (accessed via an appointment system) weekdays during term-time
- Practical support and advice throughout, including dedicated Semester Programmes team

- Membership of the Pembroke Junior Parlour

- Two receptions with the Master of Pembroke College

- Two Cambridge-style group photos with Master of Pembroke College (one in each semester)

Housing Fee*: £10,332

Rooms vary in size, location, amenities and distance from the main College site, as well as teaching and lecture venues. Cambridge does not have a campus; accommodation, teaching sites and other facilities are located around the city.

This fee covers:

 – 41 weeks' continuous accommodation in a single occupancy room in regular Cambridge College student accommodation

- Provision of linen (bedding and towels)
- Room cleaning service once a week
- Communal area cleaning service daily

*Pembroke does not offer a meal plan and food costs are not included in the programme fees above. You can choose to purchase food in the College dining hall or café (items are priced individually), or prepare your own meals. In your housing you will have access to some basic facilities for preparing food but not necessarily a full kitchen. The cost of any food purchased in College will be added to your College bill, which you'll receive at regular intervals during the programme.

**You will also need to pay a refundable caution deposit of £350 and a linen deposit of £50. These will be refunded after the end of the programme providing that your accommodation is left in good condition.
