Preachers at Sunday Evensong

- 21 January **The Acting Dean, Rev'd Sophie Young**
- 28 January **The Rev'd Dr Olga Fabrikant-Burke**, Lecturer in Old Testament and Admissions Tutor at Ridley Hall, Cambridge. Prior to Olga's appointment at Ridley, she served as Chaplain at Trinity College, Cambridge. She holds a PhD in Old Testament studies, also from Trinity.
- 4 February **The Rev'd Imogen Nay**, Climate Advisor to the Bishop of Ely and Vicar of St Paul's Church, Cambridge. As Bishop's Advisor for Climate, Imogen helps to integrate work which focusses on addressing climate issues from a Christian faith perspective. Prior to coming to Cambridge, Imogen was a Residentiary Canon at Chelmsford Cathedral.

- 11 February **The Rev'd Dr Simon Taylor KC**, Vicar of St Andrew's, Stapleford, Simon is a doctor and a barrister. He has spent most of his working life as a medical lawyer, much of it representing the families of brain-damaged babies. He was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2003, and also sits as a Recorder, a part-time judge of the Crown Court.
- 18 February **The Rev'd Dr Carole Irwin**, lead researcher for Growing in Friendship, a research project for Lyn's House, Cambridge. Carole is an ordained minister in the British Methodist Church and was Director of Studies at Wesley House until 2021. She is a member of Lyn's House, a Cambridge-based Christian community of people with and without intellectual disabilities.
- 25 February **Elizabeth Stephan**, Trustee of CamCrag – Cambridge Convoy Refugee Action Group. Elizabeth takes an active role in CamCrag, organising fundraising events and taking part in convoys to France. Elizabeth has a passion for the Arts and teaching. For 30 years she worked for the International Baccalaureate Organization, teaching, examining, and training in over 30 countries, mainly in Africa, The Middle East and Europe.
- 3 March **The Rev'd David Newton**, Director of Diocesan Ordinands, Ely Diocese. As Director of Diocesan Ordinands, David has responsibility for all those exploring a call to, and training for, ordination. Prior to this role, he was Team Rector of 11 parishes to the West of Cambridge. He recently finished a PhD entitled, 'Living with Limits', which brings theology into conversation with ecological economics.
