Preachers at Sunday Evensong

28 April	The Acting Dean, Rev'd Sophie Young
5 May	Ms Alice Whitehead , Legacies of Enslavement Research Affiliate at Pembroke. Alice joined the College in September 2023. Her research examines the historical relationship between Pembroke and the British Empire between 1600 and 1900. She has previously worked on 'Legacies of Enslavement' projects for the National Trust, as well as several other Cambridge colleges and museums.
12 May	Rev'd Canon Brynn Bayman, Framlingham College Chaplain. Fr. Brynn's 30 years of experience in education includes roles at KCS Wimbledon, Sherborne School in Dorset, and Wellington College in Berkshire. His passion is to inspire the next generation, to encourage students to set off on a spiritual journey that is broadminded and adventurous.

19 May

Sr Dr Gemma Simmons CJ, a sister of the Congregation of Jesus and Senior Research Fellow at the Margaret Beaufort Institute of Theology, Cambridge. Sr. Gemma is Director of the Religious Life Institute and teaches Christian spirituality and Pastoral Theology. She is past president of the Catholic Theological Association of Great Britain and Chair of Trustees of the Ecumenical Community of St. Anselm, Lambeth Palace. Gemma has been a missionary in Brazil, a Chaplain in the Universities of Cambridge and London, and was a Chaplaincy Volunteer in Holloway Prison for 25 years.

26 May

Professor David Ford OBE, Regius Professor of Divinity Emeritus in the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of Selwyn College. Professor Ford was founding Director of the Cambridge Inter-faith Programme (2002-2015) and a co-founder of the interfaith practice of Scriptural Reasoning. He co-chairs the Rose Castle Foundation, a centre for reconciliation, inter-faith engagement and religious literacy. He is also Chair of Trustees at Lyn's House, Cambridge.

2 June

Rev'd Canon Dr Rob Mackley, Vicar of Little St. Mary's Church, Cambridge. Fr Robert worshipped at LSM as an undergraduate, reading history at Christ's College, and then theology at Emmanuel while training for the priesthood at Westcott House. Ordained in 2003, he ministered in city centre parishes elsewhere before returning to Cambridge in 2009. He became Vicar of LSM in 2012, is a trustee of Cambridge Churches Homeless Project and is a regular columnist for the *Church Times*.

9 June

Professor Loraine Gelsthorpe, Institute of Criminology, University of Cambridge & Pembroke College. Professor Gelsthorpe is Emeritus Director of The Institute of Criminology, Co-convenor of the Cambridge Migration Research Network (CAMMIGRES) and Chair of the Centre for the Study of Global Human Movement. Her primary interests are in the links between criminal justice and social justice, looking at race, gender and social exclusion. She is also a practicing psychotherapist.
